
## Structure

#### Level 1



Guests are transported to a Medieval fairytale kingdom of candy and wonder. This is a magical land where children can find fantastical creatures hiding among lollipop trees. Here, the opportunities to play are endless – brave explorers can even climb the castle into the clouds above.

## Level 3



Congrats, you've made it!
From the top of the castle,
all of Glycium can be seen.
Some sights – and friends!
– are only visible here
above the clouds.

## Level 2



Guests who exit the castle here may find themselves shrunken to the size of a candy fairy. The fairies can be quite mischievous in their tricks, but they are friendly creatures who welcome everyone to join their games as they play with fellow woodland creatures.

## 1. The Entrance

- As guests enter the Glycium Play Park they are greeted with a cotton candy themed lobby.
- The lobby is meant to evoke a feeling of wonder and whimsy.
- This is meant as the liminal space that signals a threshold of crossing over from the real world into a world of imagination.
- As guests enter they will see a check-in desk.



- At the desk each parent is given a "magic band"-like wristband, while children get a wristband with a corresponding barcode.
- This will ensure no parent can leave without a child or with a child that's not theirs.
- Parents will also be alerted when their child goes up and down floors or into the activity room.


## 2. The Castle

- The Candy themed Castle acts as the Weenie and is the main focal point as guests first enter Glycium.
- The castle goes up the entire three levels of the Glycium Play Park. The top floor features a slide that goes back to the ground floor.
- The interior ramp spirals up with a climbing wall through the Castle's center. Screens are used as windows, showing Gingerbread Village and Lolli-Woods with looping animations of different creatures and people.





## 2. The Castle



#### Castle Exterior

The castle Exterior is made of wood and plastic to give the effect of weathered stone as seen in the image below



#### **Tube Slide**

Plastic Tube Slide with see through top. The bottom of the slide is fenced to keep children both in and around the slide safe.



#### Meringues

Soft Meringues made of Foam for a squishy and fun sensory toy



#### Cloud Mural

Clouds will be drawn around the top of the castle to give the effect of it vanishing into the clouds



#### **Climbing Net**

The interior of the castle will have a climbing net running through it from one floor to the next



# 3. Climbing Cake



- A unique take on the classic climbing wall.
- Made out of a steel structure and covered with thick layers of padding.
- Long rainbow "sprinkles" are used as hand holds.
- A "crash mat" is surrounding the Climbing Cake.



# 4. LED Play Area

## Lolli-Woods

- Children entering this area will find themselves in the heart of a lollipop-tree forest.
- High defection XR LED dome creates a unique space that immerses the guest in the forest
- To reach the center, guests will walk through biff bash bags in the shape of lollipop trees. This interaction will enhance the sense of discovery and exploration that this area fosters.
- The jungle gym in the middle of the grove is designed to look like an old tree.
- Kids approaching the walls will be able to reveal different candy creatures.







## 4. Lolli-Woods



#### **Lollypop Trees**

The lollypop trees are made of flexible biff bash bags for fun and squishy exploration



#### Tree Jungle Gym

The Jungle Gym structure is made of Plastic. The inside has a staircase that leads to a slide and room to play inside

  - In costume employees help maintain the magic.






## 6. Parent Area & Amenities

# Sprinkle Springs

- A waterfall of colorful sprinkles spills overs a cliff and pools into a whimsical ball pit, forming Sprinkle Springs. Witty explorers could make their way to the ledge on the far bank and discover a secret shortcut to Pixie's garden.
- Projection mapping creates the image of the waterfall on the wall. It also provides color for the ball pit itself, creating evershifting patterns of swirling color.







# 8. Fairy Playhouse Pixie's Cottage

- This cabin at the heart of Fairy Forest belongs to Pixie Stix, a mischievous candy fairy who is one of Glycium's mascots. Visitors can spot her playing in the treetops. Pixie is always happy to have guests around – especially if they help her with her gardening.
- This play house is designed to encourage imaginative free play. The furnishings in the house allow children to make-believe they are living in Pixie's fairy hideaway.
- Outside the house is a fenced garden with projection games. The games will allow kids to interact with the garden more actively.

The Play house will be made of plastic and wood, with three rooms inside: A kitchen, a Livingroom, and a bed






#### **Projection Game**

Having climbed to the third floor, guests will find themselves on the balcony at top of the castle.



From the edge of the balcony the most majestic sight of all, a candy dragon sitting on top of the clouds, peacefully watching the forest below.












## About Me
